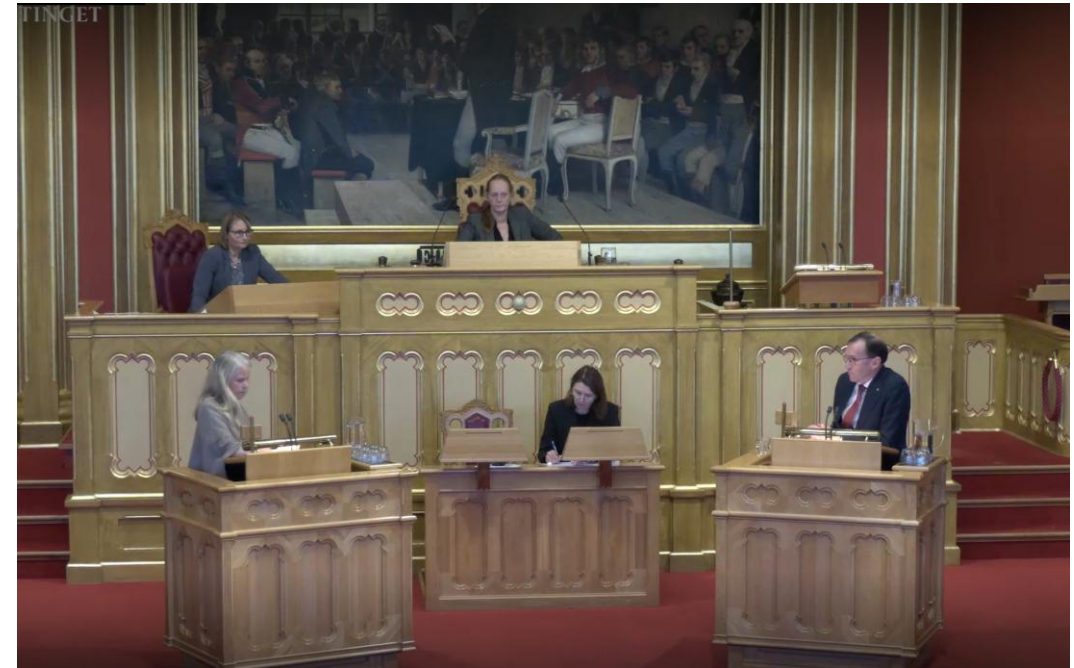

Annual Parliamentary white paper on Norwegian Exports of Defence-Related Products

- Norway aims for the greatest possible transparency in the export of arms and defence-related materiel.
- Since 1997, the Government has published annual white papers on defence-related exports, reviewed by Parliament.
- The purpose of presenting annual white papers is:
 - Report on all defence-related exports during the previous year
 - Explain Norway's export control policy and practices
- This reporting regime strengthens transparency and supports an informed public debate.
- The white paper serves as a key reference document for practitioners, media, and researchers.

Content:

- Economic value of all exported defence-related materiel for military end use in the previous year

- Transfers of the Armed Forces' and National Police's materiel
- Export of protective equipment for humanitarian purposes
- Refusals of license applications
- Overview of processed export control cases
- Overview of companies reporting exports
- Exports of defence materiel to Ukraine

Norway does not redact or withhold information in the annual white paper; all data reflects actual exports reported by exporters according to the licenses granted.

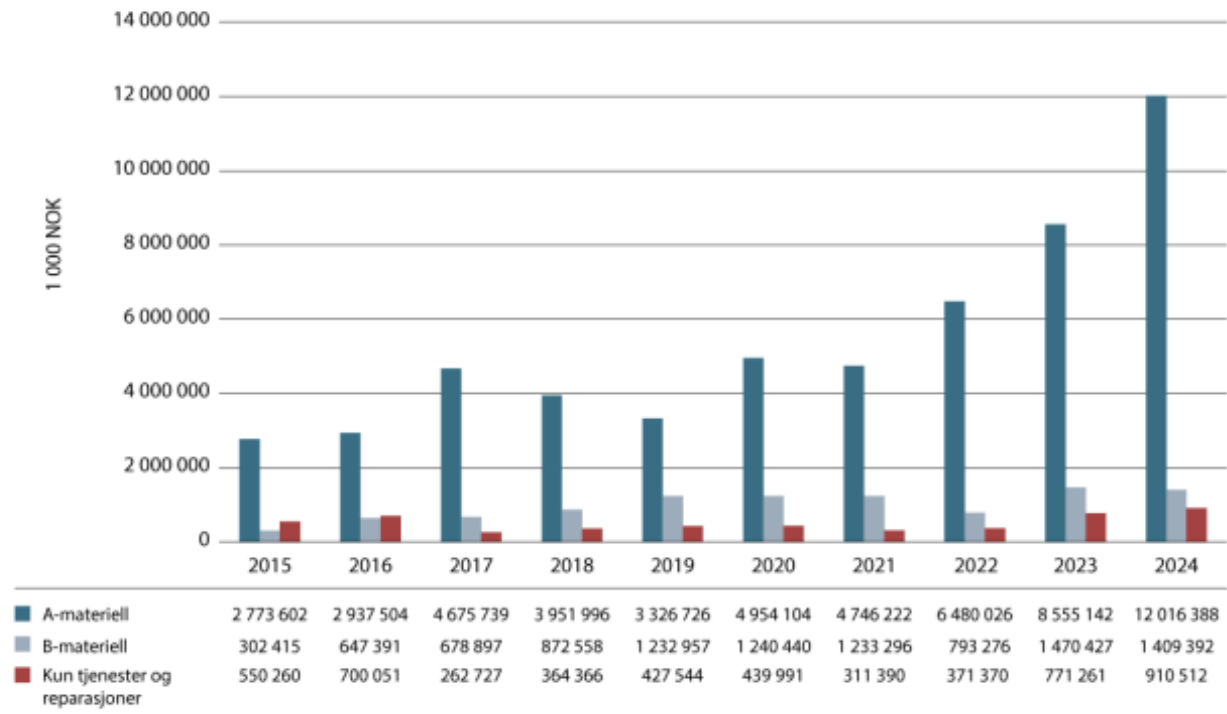
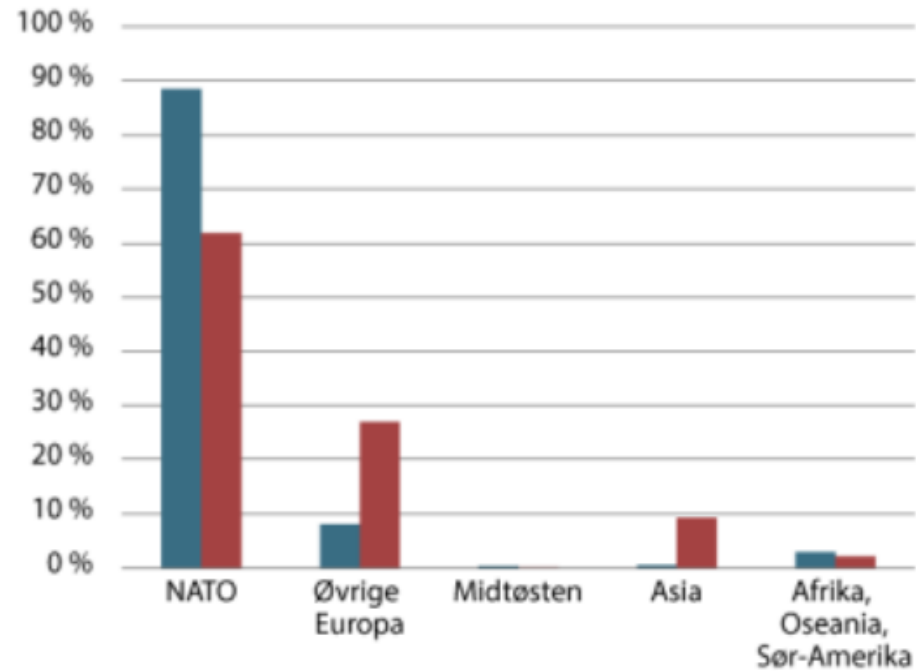


Figure 11.1 Exports of defence-related products (2015–2024) in NOK 1 000

Figure 11.1 shows exports of category A and category B products, as well as services and repairs to List I products carried out for foreign clients in the period 2015–2024.

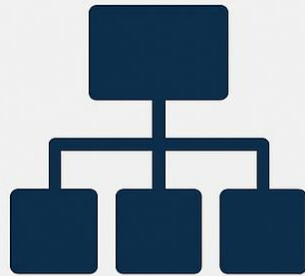

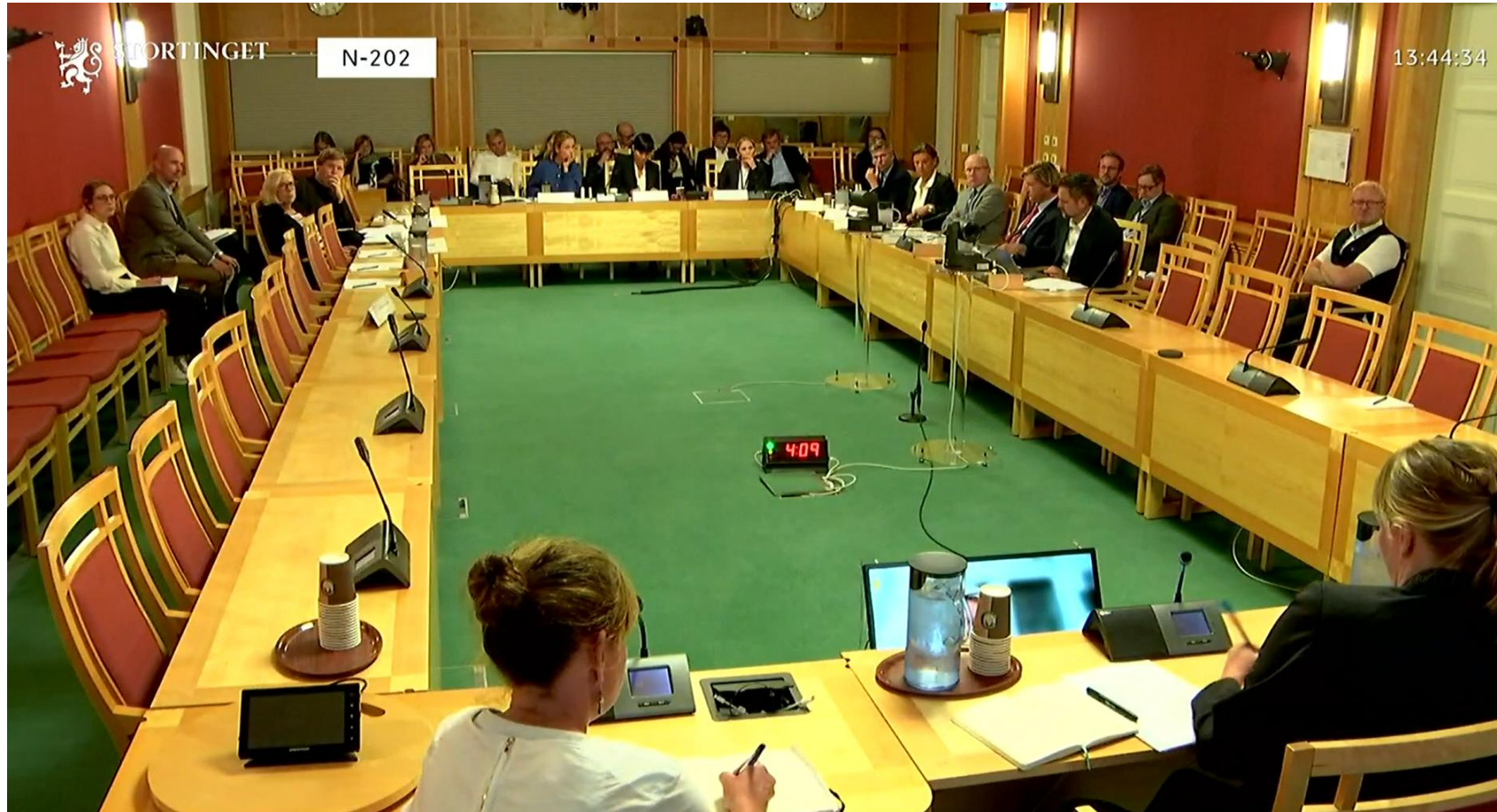
