Description:	<p><i>The EU-funded iTrace Global Weapon Reporting System project was launched in 2014. In that time, Conflict Armament Research has documented tens of thousands of conventional weapons, ammunition, and component parts on the ground in more than 25 conflict-affected countries. This data set forms the first truly global baseline of data relating to the diversion of arms to the illicit market. During this session, CAR will present new analysis of iTrace diversion data to provide policy makers and export practitioners with the empirical evidence required to form effective counter-diversion strategies.</i></p>
