Description:	<p><i>This event will launch the ATT Monitor’s case study on how the risks of GBV can be addressed in risk-assessments.</i></p> <p><i>The ATT Monitor case study provides practical guidance for ATT States Parties on key elements of an assessment for risks relating to serious acts of GBV.
