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Tasks assigned to Secretariat: Treaty Implementation

ATT Secretariat

is requested to

- release the sections of the Voluntary Guide to Implementing Articles 6 & 7 of the ATT which address the implementation of Article 7 (4) as a separate fact sheet to highlight the importance of assessing the risk of conventional arms being used for GBV or violence against women and children

States Parties and
the ATT Secretariat

are encouraged to

- continue engaging with relevant industry actors, including logistical actors, and involve these actors in ongoing discussions regarding their role in responsible arms transfers

Tasks assigned to Secretariat: Transparency and Reporting

ATT Secretariat **is requested to**

- mark Initial Reports that have been updated on the Initial Reports page of the ATT website
- support the [WGTR's] assessment [of the Information Exchange Platform and the online reporting tool] by conducting a survey among States Parties concerning the use of the Information Exchange Platform and the online reporting tool and providing a report to the WGTR [...]

ATT Secretariat **is encouraged to**

- facilitate the use of the ATT Reporting Templates, the Voluntary Guidance on the Practice of Annual Reporting and other existing ATT reporting guidance tools by optimizing their format and their provision on the ATT website within the Secretariat's allocated budget, as well as to ensure wide dissemination of the Voluntary Guidance, including to other reporting assistance providers

Tasks assigned to Secretariat: Treaty Universalization

ATT Secretariat,
States Parties and
future Presidents **are encouraged to**

- maintain and strengthen the **strategic partnership with the Inter-Parliamentary Union (IPU)**, including through joint advocacy activities to engage parliamentarians on the ATT's universalization objectives. Such collaboration could focus on raising awareness, supporting legislative alignment, and fostering political will for Treaty ratification and effective implementation. Experiences from recent IPU engagements could serve as a basis for future cooperation.

Tasks assigned to Secretariat: Review Programme of Work (MC)

all office holders
and the Secretariat

are requested to

- to continue ensuring the timely circulation of documentation, the streamlining of documents across Working Groups and the inclusion of targeted guiding questions for all agenda items

ATT Secretariat

is encouraged to

- explore options for:
 - i) more cost-effective interpretation services for working group meetings and informal preparatory meetings, such as remote interpretation;
 - ii) secure venues that ensure stringent security standards and are better suited to typical attendance levels for Working Group and Informal Preparatory meetings;
 - iii) ways to monitor remote participation more effectively
- conduct intersessional briefing sessions for Geneva-based Points of Contact

Other decisions:

Encouragements of States

States in a position to do so **are encouraged to**

- contribute to the [ATT Sponsorship] Programme

States in a position to do so **are encouraged to**

- contribute to the [VTF] in support of Treaty implementation and universalisation

States with financial arrears **are called on to**

- address their financial obligations in a prompt and timely manner, and make use of the financial mechanism for the settlement of arrears

Other decisions:

Five-year strategy for the ATT

*The Conference agreed to request that the ATT Secretariat issue a **call for proposals** before the next ATT Working Group meetings to States Parties and other stakeholders to submit **objectives and priorities, as well as possible actions and performance measures** which could be taken in pursuit of these objectives and priorities, considering all aspects of the Treaty, with a view to elaborating elements of a draft 5-year strategy.*

*This draft strategy should be **put to a decision by no later than CSP13**.*

*An **extended ATT Bureau**, convened by the ATT Secretariat, and consisting of the ATT President and Vice Presidents, Working Group Chairs, Dief Chair, VTF Chair, and Gender Focal Point(s) (if established) will draw together these elements and proposals into the form of a draft strategy. The extended ATT Bureau will appoint a lead point of contact among officeholders to convene its work.*

*The extended ATT Bureau, with the facilitation of the ATT Secretariat, will hold at least two **informal virtual consultations** on the draft strategy ahead of CSP12, at least one of which shall be for all ATT stakeholders, and shall otherwise be encouraged to communicate and engage proactively and transparently on the development of a strategy, including providing an **update at CSP12**.*

Youth participation

*State Parties and other stakeholders are encouraged to consider youth perspectives in the work of the ATT and explore **measures to strengthen the meaningful participation, engagement and leadership of young people in ATT implementation and universalization efforts** during the next CSP-cycles*
